Making a difference through the Child and Family Sponsorship Program at Casa Hogar

This program pairs a sponsor with an individual child or a family. Whether the sponsor chooses to sponsor an individual child or one of the nine families, sponsors have the unique opportunity of developing a personal relationship with a child or a family at Casa Hogar.

Building a Relationship is Truly a Gift

Sponsors have the distinct advantage of building a personal relationship with a child or family at Casa Hogar which is why we hope that sponsorships continue for years. Having a sponsor means a lot to the children; they know that there is someone in particular, whom they do not see every day, that loves them. Because we have sponsors that continue their sponsorship for years, the children often develop close relationships with their sponsors, sharing a great deal of themselves with them.

Getting to Know the Kids at Casa Hogar

As much as you want to know the child or family you sponsor, so too do the children in Peru want to know you. Often the first question they ask after being told they were matched with a new sponsor is "Can I write them?".

The children love writing to their sponsors. Twice a year the children send a personal message to their sponsor, often times creating a homemade card or decorating their letter. Those letters are brought to the United States by the next person traveling to Wisconsin and sent to the sponsors. In addition to letter writing, emails and video calls have also become ways to connect the children with their sponsor.

We encourage you to write to the child or family as often as you like. The children love to receive letters and to build connections with their sponsors! Correspondence can be done through international mail, mailing to the Diocesan Mission office or by email.

Without Sponsors Nothing is Possible

Your sponsorship of \$1,000 a year makes a huge difference! Given the current cost of living in Peru it is estimated to take \$5,000 a year to provide each child with food, education, clothing, medical, psychological, and dental care, vocational training, as well as the cost to implement the family-model program, providing them a loving family environment that makes our organization unique.





Frequently Asked Questions

Can I sponsor more than one child?

The joy, friendship, financial, and moral support that each sponsor provides the children is so important that we do not want to limit the number that any individual or organization sponsors.

How am I matched with a child or family?

Sponsors can choose the child they wish to sponsor. This is often done if they have visited Casa Hogar and formed a bond with a child or if they have a particular interest that is similar to a child. Children can also be matched by Casa Hogar based on the needs and status of sponsorships.

Will a child have more than one sponsor?

Children may have more than one sponsor but no one will have more than five sponsors so that the children can have a unique relationship and correspondence with each of their sponsors.

What if I don't speak Spanish?

We will translate the letters you write into Spanish and translate the letters your child or family writes to you into English. We will also send you the original letter that your child or family wrote so you can see any pictures they drew or photos they included.
